There may be times when you need to see a new healthcare provider, like in an emergency or at a specialist appointment. If you or your loved one is ever hospitalized, make sure to show them this card. The wallet card below offers a quick and easy way to let them know you or your loved one is taking an anti-amyloid treatment, and important information to be aware of.

ARIA symptoms can look like stroke symptoms. Use caution with certain medications.

Anti-amyloid treatments can cause serious side effects, including ARIA (amyloid-related imaging abnormalities). ARIA can be fatal. ARIA symptoms can look like stroke symptoms, including headache, confusion, dizziness, vision changes, nausea, difficulty walking, or seizures.

You may be at a higher risk of developing bleeding in the brain if you take medicines to reduce blood clots from forming (antithrombotic medicines) while receiving anti-amyloid treatments.
